ACT! LIKE A LOCAL

GREET LIKE A LOCAL
When you meet a local, a handshake or a fist bump is appropriate. Our way to greet each other becomes more intimate the better we know each other. Between friends, we greet each other with a hug or 3 kisses. It can get really cringe when a Luxembourgish person greets a friend from France or Belgium (2 to 4 kisses in France, and 1 kiss or handshake in Belgium).

TALK LIKE A LOCAL
When you walk through the streets of Esch, you will most likely hear at least 3 different languages. English is actually our 4th, often even the 5th language. The most spoken is French, because a lot of people who work in Esch come from our neighbouring countries (Belgium & France).

DEBATE BEER LIKE A LOCAL
Battin, Bofferding, Superbock, which is the best?! We never seem to agree, everyone has a strong opinion (stronger than the beer itself sometimes!) on their favourite. It can lead to long (drunk) and repetitive (never-ending) discussions. One thing we all agree on, we do not like Diekirch beer (from the far far north).

WHERE ARE ALL THE LOCALS?!
August is THE month for our summer break. For once, the weekends might be quiet and the streets deserted. If you tend to be an introvert, this is your opportunity to have Esch all for yourself. Don't worry though, everything is still open for an unforgettable summer experience (see save the date).

SOCIALISE WITH A LOCAL
You get the impression locals don't talk to you, avoid eye contact and generally seem grumpy? Well, we are introverts! Awkward convos is what you can expect from smiling at or randomly talking to a local on the bus. Don't worry, we will open up once we feel comfortable. Please just be patient with us!

MOVE LIKE A LOCAL
Esch has a pretty compact city centre, so you can pretty much walk everywhere in under 20 minutes. Locals also use public transportation to get around, especially when it rains (or when they're feeling lazy). Stroll around the city, and if you get tired (or want to visit Belval), just jump on a bus - remember, it's free! The only downside is that buses don't run late on weekdays (until 11pm), and that taxis are really, really expensive.

PARTY LIKE A LOCAL
Esch is not a party city, most bars close around 1am and we don't have clubs here. Most locals go to Luxembourg City to party (around 30 minutes by train). Don't forget to check the train timetable (cfl.lu) since they don't drive all night.

Spots & Tips

1 MEXICAN FIESTA
10-12, Avenue du Swing
Looking for a fun night out with Mexican food and special cocktails? Look no further and go to Coyote. Their big terrace is the perfect spot to enjoy the warm weather, and they're veggie and vegan friendly, too. Just be sure to book a table in advance on weekends, as this popular spot tends to fill up quickly.

2 SPICE HAVEN
8, Rue Le Bataclan
Craving some Indian flavors? Bombay Inn is the best Indian restaurant in town. It serves huge portions of sizzling dishes kept warm on hot plates. And for those who prefer dining outside, their terrace is the perfect spot to enjoy your meal in peace, tucked away in a quiet hidden area.

3 MUSIC, COFFEE & BEERS
1, Avenue du Swing
At MK Bar (short for Mix N' Kawa) come in for a drink, stay for the staff! They are funny, passionate and chatty. We recommend trying a delicious beer here. A lot of concerts are organized in the evenings, so if you love rock or metal music you are in the right place.

4 NICE SUSHI TRAIN
14, Avenue du Rock'n'Roll
In the mood for Asian food? Origami's wide selection of both buffet and sushi train options might be just what you need for a satisfying meal that hits the spot. Good to know: the sushi train is cheaper for lunch than for dinner.

5 FAST & FRIENDLY
14, Avenue du Rock'n'Roll
In the mood for some yummy Italian food? Duca & Friends offers generous portions and fast, friendly service. They serve up delicious, mouthwatering Italian dishes that are sure to leave you feeling satisfied.

6 UNLEASH YOUR INNER SHOPAHOLIC
7-14, Avenue du Rock'n'Roll
Treat your soul to a little retail therapy at the Belval Plaza mall. There is a variety of shops, restaurants and bars to enjoy. Looking for something to do after hours? Check out Kinopolis for late-night movie screenings. If you are driving by car, parking is easy, but we recommend using public transportation. The train station is connected to the shopping mall and there is only one stop from Esch to Belval!

7 WINTER WONDERLAND
7, Avenue du Rock'n'Roll
Picture this: it's a cold winter night and you're sitting in front of a campfire with a hot drink in your hand, a blanket wrapped around you and surrounded by fairy lights. All of this can be experienced at the Monument's Café. I personally really like meeting up here late at night with friends and playing a round of cards. You also have the possibility to enjoy a variety of different hookah flavors. No matter which experiences you choose, you will always be met by their kind and welcoming staff."

8 WHERE SHHH HAPPENS
7, Ennert den Héichiewen
Furnished with colorful study cubes, the Learning Centre is the perfect place to get work done. No need for an invitation - everyone is welcome to visit. Be aware though: you will not find any novels here, strictly academic books.

9 YOU HAD ME AT BRUNCH!
6, Ennert den Héichiewen
If a big fancy chandelier catches your eye, you will know that you arrived at the Café Saga. Weekly lunch menus will keep you coming back for more, and their quiz nights every Thursday are the perfect chance to show off your smarts (or lack thereof - they won't judge). Come for the food, stay for the fun, and leave with a belly full of laughs and deliciousness.

10 SOMETHING OLD, SOMETHING NEW
6, Ennert den Héichiewen
This café is run by a friendly couple who are passionate about providing delicious food and drinks in a unique setting. Dalmat Coffee House's menu includes fresh cakes and also vegan options. The café's architecture is truly one-of-a-kind. As you sip your coffee, you can see parts of the blast furnace*, which was included in the architectural design.

11 WHAT A VIEW!
10-12, Avenue du Swing
The blast furnaces - Héichuewen in Luxembourgish - of Belval are a major tourist attraction and cultural highlight. The blast furnace is a type of metallurgical furnace used for smelting to produce industrial metals. Our blast furnaces are witnesses to Belval's industrial past. They can still be visited today, extensively preserved and skillfully integrated in the new urban context. You can climb up 180 steps to reach a height of 40m in blast furnace A. From there, you'll have an amazing view of Esch and Belval.

12 LIVE MUSIC!?
5, Avenue du Rock'n'Roll
Fancy a concert? Rockhal is the biggest concert venue in Luxembourg and the perfect place to enjoy international shows of all music styles! Check out their agenda, grab a ticket and you are good to go! If you go inside, watch out for the car on the ceiling...

13 THE WINDY BRIDGE THAT BONDS
An der Schmelz
The Vélodukt is the longest bicycle bridge in Europe and it connects Belval and Esch centre. Be careful, there are two lanes there: one for bikes and one for pedestrians, besides it gets windy up there, so don't forget to bring a jacket!

14 GIMME PIZZA, WEIRD MACHINE!
7, Cité Verte
It's the middle of night, all the food places are closed but you still want to eat pizza? We feel you! The Pizza Automat got you covered: a fully self-operating pizza-producing machine. Perfect for your drunk munchies.

15 THIS IS NOT A CANDY SHOP
14, Rue Marcel Leintz
If you like the street art in Esch, then you will love the Kamellebutek art gallery (literally Candy shop). This unique gallery is dedicated to showcasing urban art and graffiti, with an emphasis on local artists from the Esch area. Even though it's located in a living area, you'll definitely recognize it as soon as you see the facade.

16 ONE OF OUR LOCAL FAVORITES
55, Rue du Clair-Chêne
The Escher Kafé is a cosy spot in Esch with a warm and welcoming atmosphere. Claude and his team make you feel at home, and the terrace is perfect for enjoying a drink during golden hour. On cold days, the wood stove provides a lovely heat, and the local beer selection is great.

17 LUIS CASA ES TU CASA
5, Rue Stalingrad
You can feel the familial atmosphere as soon as you enter. Their beef and pork are juicy and the salmon is tender as butter. In case you are a person who has a big appetite, you are in good hands at Chez Luis. If you want to make a good impression, greet them with an 'Ola'.

18 RESISTANCE AND HUMAN RIGHTS
Place de la Résistance
If you feel like getting to know the history of Luxembourg during the Second World War, the Musée de la résistance et des Droits Humains in the city center has all the information you need! It describes Luxembourg's history from the German invasion in 1940, to the beginning of the Nazi regime, until the liberation in 1944 and the arrival of the Americans in 1945.

19 ARISTON
9, Rue Pierre Claude
Ariston, one of the first cinemas in town, has been transformed into an annex of the Escher Theater (see next tip), which has made it an exciting new space presenting theatre pieces and performances for younger audiences and more.

20 LET THE SHOW BEGIN!
122, Rue de l'Alzette
If you love culture, the Escher Theater is the perfect spot! It mostly hosts theatre but also dance or music performances (from Luxembourg and abroad). Carole's team is passionate and you can feel it in the programming. Make sure to check their agenda and be sure to pay attention to the language in which the shows are.

21 CHICK-PEAS PLEASE!
125, Rue de l'Alzette
You are starting to think that we eat meat for every meal? Chiche is here for your veggie and vegan cravings! Lebanese cuisine in a beautifully decorated setting, do we need to say more?

22 POP-UP
121, Rue de l'Alzette
The Pop-Up Store opened its doors in 2022. What you'll find here during your visit, we cannot tell you, since it changes constantly. One thing for sure: it gives small businesses the chance to become more popular. It can also be that you'll find an exhibition of some sort. Don't hesitate to swing by.

23 24 BRUNCH & COCKTAILS
101, Rue de l'Alzette
Eating eggs in several different ways, tartine, bagels or a huge avocado toast on the terrace of 24 Brunch & Cocktails while observing the busy Zelzchterstroos is quite the vibe. If you want a quieter atmosphere, you can also have your food inside. You will have to wait longer on a crowded day but it's really worth it.

24 A CLOUD TO GO PLEASE!
89, Rue de l'Alzette
Enjoy Luxembourg's best pizza at Cloud Factory. The restaurant recently won the award for "Top Pizzeria in Luxembourg" and it definitely deserves it. As the name says it already, their pizza is like a fluffy cloud and takes you to pizza heaven.

25 UNE BAGUETTE S'IL VOUS PLAÎT!
55, Rue de la Libération
The Patisserie Gerard Cayotte is known for their delicious baguettes! But, buttery croissants, chocolate filled ones and many more delicious pastries are also waiting for you and your sweet tooth...

26 BALKAN BITES
27, Rue du Brill
Step into the Snack Palas and be transported right to Montenegro. Here you can find all the Montenegrin dishes that exist (see "eat like a local"). And if you're tired of greasy fast foods, they've got some homemade stews that will make you feel like you're in a grandma's kitchen.

27 THE JUNGLE OASIS
22, Rue du Brill
Looking to unwind with shisha and cocktails enveloped by lush greenery that transports you to a garden oasis? Look no further than Yolo: the ideal destination filled with an extensive range of shishas and cocktails.

28 MY PERSONAL GARDEN
118-120 Bd John F. Kennedy
Need a break from the hustle and bustle? Cockerills Park has got you covered! With a serene atmosphere and picturesque scenery, it's the perfect spot to kick back, soak up the sun, and capture some Insta-worthy pics. It feels like my own garden. I spend a lot of time here in the summer. I have studied here frequently and also came to have regular brunches with my best friend."

29 FOR THE BIG APPETITE
134, Boulevard John Fitzgerald
Whether you're a seasoned fan of Portuguese food or a first-timer, you'll love O Forno, located just a stone away from the city center. Their menu features a variety of dishes, including their signature "All You Can Eat Rodizio de Picanha".

30 LAST NIGHT A DÖNER SAVED MY LIFE
14, Rue d'Audun
Best kebab in the city! Perfect for a late-night snack, Euro Kebab is open until 2:15 am. Just remember to bring cash, because they do not accept payment by card.

31 MINETT FIELDS FOREVER
Rue Jean-Pierre Bausch
"Up for a walk? The Minett Trail is - literally - the hottest spot to enjoy the particularities of our territory, in particular the perks of the Terres Rouges. It starts at the passerelle right next to the train station and goes on for 90km of beautiful paths, crossing 8 natural reserves. Just make sure you follow the right symbol, breathe and have fun! Ah! You can also sleep around and experience the sounds of our biodiversity by searching for our Kabaisercher (accommodation built especially for the Minett Trail that offers hikers the opportunity to rest overnight)."

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32 THE BREAD MACHINE
1, Bd Pierre Dupong
The bakeries are all closed already, but you're craving a baguette? The **Baguettes Automot** got you covered. It is a vending machine for baguettes. The machine is designed to keep the baguettes warm and ready to eat, so that you can enjoy a delicious, freshly baked baguette at any time of the day (or night).

33 KUFA
116, Rue de Luxembourg
Kulturfabrik - a.k.a Kufa - is a cultural centre located in the buildings of the former municipal abattoir. On 4500m2, you will find: two performance halls, a gallery, a cinema, a brasserie (K116), a bistro (the **Ratelach** - rat hole in english) and several rehearsal rooms. If you love street art, you have to go here. In fact, the huge project **Kufas' Urban Art Esch** (see the pink Art Walk on the map) was created by and at Kufa. The staff here wanted to make the building more beautiful with a few murals and then the project invaded the city and has even gone beyond the borders. More than 70 artworks were released between 2014 and 2021.

34 FUJIYUMMY!
57, Rue Jean-Pierre Michels
Where are our asian-food-lovers? **Fujiyama** proposes dishes and a sushi menu. At lunchtime during the week, you can enjoy the open buffet. It goes off a bit more hastily because people have to go back to work. So you can serve yourselves at the buffet or enjoy a relaxed dinner in the evening. The food is fresh and delicious, the ambience pleasant and inviting. Made for an evening among friends, family or even lovers.

36 GIVE AND/OR TAKE
116, Rue de Luxembourg
"Second hand clothes are a big passion of mine. And I am lucky because I work at Kulturfabrik, next to a **Give Box**. I began all my working days there checking treasures while having a cup of coffee. I've found my most favorite clothes here. I also love to take books from the Give Box, read them and bring them back."

38 ART WALK
A project, which marked Esch in a beautiful way, was the Kufa's Urban Art Esch. Artists both local and international realized 50 murals in Esch. We've created the **Art Walk** for you to pass all our favorite frescoes which are perfect to take insta-worthy pictures while discovering our city. Good to know: you can buy a book about the project at Diderich.

39 LOCAL POOL
1, Pl. des Scieriffes
The **Escher Schwemm** is our local pool, perfect for swimming during winter. However, during hot summer days, it can get quite crowded with people also because of the outside pool area. Make sure to check the opening hours before you go! One of the great things about it, is that it's connected to **Laval's Park**, which provides a beautiful green space. And when you're getting hungry from all the swimming, head to **Club 5**, the restaurant located on the premises and known for their delicious carpaccio.

37 NEVER DRINK ON AN EMPTY STOMACH
37, Rue du Fossé
Takeaway before drinking, takeaway for drunken hunger, takeaway for hangovers... **Snack Istanbul** got you covered! *Un durum avec tout, sauce blanche* is the vocabulary when you want a *durum* with everything and *white sauce*. Yum! Of course, they have other dishes on their menu as well.

38 READ & EAT
2, Rue Victor Hugo
Our last remaining bookshop has a concept that's maybe known in other countries but the first in Luxembourg. At **Diderich** you can buy a book and start reading it right away over a coffee and a piece of carrot cake. Here you can also find your next favorite journal and pen to write about your adventures in Esch.

39 COFFEE IS THEIR PROFESSION
26, Rue des Remparts
The main meeting point for students after school, **Babbocaffé** became really popular really fast. This isn't a coincidence, because they serve the best coffee in Esch. If coffee isn't your thing, you can always enjoy a milkshake on their terrace.

40 THE BAR
27, Grand-Rue
"Pitcher is THE Escher bar! I love how you always end up meeting old friends you did not think you'd see that night. You HAVE TO try the Bloen Neckel, a vodka and curacao based mini-pitcher to share as shots! Make sure to bring cash & be prepared for big crowds on Fridays and Saturdays."

41 UELZECHT, OUR HIDDEN RIVER
66, Rue du Luxembourg
Our whole city is named after the river **Uelzech** (Alzette) but you can't see it! In fact, the river runs under the city. The only place where you can actually see it is at the **Schlassgoart**, the castle garden in English. You may ask yourself, why is it called castle garden when there is no castle, well that's because it's gone, the only part they kept is the pink tower. Apparently, we love contradictions!

42 TINY ITALIAN DELIGHT
3, Rue des Artisans
Do not be fooled by its looks, this restaurant is tiny but has a big variety of delicious dishes! **Il Grana d'Oro** is very popular amongst pupils, so be prepared for a queue when high schools have their lunch break. But the wait is worth it. It's usual to order their dishes as takeaways since there are not a lot of seats here.

43 IT'S A (LOVE) STORY!
6, Rue du Commerce
La Storia is an Italian restaurant with a friendly atmosphere. Located in the centre, it's perfect for a delicious pizza or excellent pasta to start your evening. Do not miss it!

44 VEGGIE VIBES ONLY
1, Rue du Moulin
This affordable grocery shop, bar and restaurant is not only a feast for your taste buds, but also for your eyes. Their colorful dishes will make you forget all about meat. And that's not all: **Mesa** (for Maison de la Transition) also organizes events and activities about zero waste and upcycling. Card payments are not accepted - cash only!

45 THE STREET ABOVE THE RIVER
Rue de l'Alzette
The main street in Esch were all the action happens in the **Uelzechstrooss**. It starts at the **Gemengenplaz** (place de d'Hôtel de Ville), town square and ends at the **Brillplaz**. It is the longest shopping street in the country. The town square hosts the weekly market and some events - like the Gay Pride. The flea market is taking place at the Brillplaz. Since 2022, you can take the Uelzech Mobil: a small shuttle that drives you from one end of the street to the other at a really slow pace (so if you want to check your instagram in peace, go for it).

46 FREE BOOKS
Place de l'Hôtel de Ville
Next to city hall you'll find a blue box with books in it. The **Bischerschaaf** is for second hand books you can grab one, leave one behind or both. When you leave a book make sure to write a little note in it, for its future owner you may get the chance to inspire other people. Don't miss the musical steps just next to the book box!

47 A THOUSAND AND ONE BOARD GAMES
8, Rue Berwart
A group of friends lost their favorite pub, where they used to meet up and play board games. Because they didn't want to lose their tradition they decided to open their own pub. That's how **Minettsdäpp** was founded. A pub with over 1000 different board games in a cosy setting. Every last Thursday of the month they organize a pub-quiz in Luxembourgish and English. They even have an Escape Room available in English and three other languages.

48 THE BROTHERS
34, Rue de l'Alzette
A snack spot with a family feel. **Les Frères** is a family-owned business that serves up fast food and delicious Iraqi specialties. To our veggie friends: trust us and please taste their falafel wrap!

50 GOOD TASTY
12, Av. de la Gare
Good Tasty offers homemade Brazilian specialties. Let yourself be tempted by a delicious breakfast with an "Acai na Tigela": superfood-breakfast bowl brazilian art.

51 BRAINFREEZE NEVER TASTED THIS GOOD
14-16, Av. de la Gare
This place looks like a medicine cabinet from the outside, and the **Happy Cure** is the sweetest remedy around. Build your own frozen yogurt masterpiece with more toppings than you can think of, and don't forget to grab some crazy American snacks on your way out. Your taste buds will thank you (but your dentist may not).

52 SUSHI, SLEEP, REPEAT
64, Bd J. F. Kennedy
Perfectly located in front of the central station and the Youth Hostel, you'll find the **Sushi Panda** restaurant. Eating at the restaurant, takeaway and delivery: all those are the possibilities to get their tasty sushi to your hungry belly.

53 ALL ROADS LEAD TO GAALGEBIERG
There are four different ways through which you can access the Gaalgebierg (see next spot). If you like a little workout, we recommend you to take the Dieswee or the rue du Stade. If you prefer a less challenging way with a great view, you should take the **Passerelle**, a footbridge right next to the **Youth Hostel**. And for those who don't get enough of the free transport there is also the Gaalgebue, a shuttle that takes you on top of the mountain.

54 GAALGEBIERG
Gaalgebierg
"Bring your picnic blanket, buy some snacks and drinks in one of the little supermarkets like Delhaize, Cactus or Carrefour near city hall and off you go to **Gaalgebierg** to enjoy a lovely view of Esch. There's a possibility to take a free book from the **Bicherschaaf** on the way and then later enjoy the stars on the Gaalgebierg. If you get a chance to visit Esch in the month of July, there is the yearly event "**LBO - Luxembourg Beach Open**" (see 'save the dates'). Cold drinks, good music, parties, volleyball tournaments and much more will be celebrated at the 28th edition of LBO."

55 OUR LOCAL ZOO
64, Gaalgebierg
"A place where I've felt connected to since I was a child is the **Escher Déierepark**. I grew up with it and have a lot of good memories there. It's a place where you can have a picnic close to some of your favorite animals (goats and deer, and even raccoons) - there's a lot of them! It's a place where you're guaranteed to have fun and make some good memories. Go check it out, you'll love it and it is free!"

56 LATTE AMONG LEAVES
64, Gaalgebierg


Eat & Drink LIKE a LOCAL

Esch is very international. Over 120 different nationalities are represented. So, your taste buds are definitely gonna travel!

- SALTY DISHES**
- Gromperkichelcher** (Luxembourg): like hash browns but better
 - Kniddelen** (Luxembourg): huge ugly but delicious dumplings
 - Grillwurscht** (Luxembourg): white yummy sausage
 - Metwurscht** (Luxembourg): red yummy sausage
 - Cevapi** (Montenegro): grilled dish of minced meat usually served in a flatbread with different toppings
 - Pita or mantije** (Montenegro): baked pastries of thin dough usually filled with meat, cheese, potatoes, or spinach
 - Leitão** (Portugal): crispy pork meat often served with chips on the side
 - Francesinha** (Portugal): sandwich filled with different meats, covered with cheese, and served on a bed of sauce
 - Bacalhau** (Portugal): oven baked cod fish usually paired with potatoes
 - Kebab** (Turkish): grilled meat in fluffy bread with the toppings and sauce of your choice
 - Pão de queijo** (Brazil): brazilian cheeseballs
 - Coxinha** (Brazil): deep fried chicken meat balls
 - Pastel** (Brazil): brownish fried pie with different fillings

- Boxemännchen** (Luxembourg): brioche shaped man (available only in December)
 - Fueskichelcher** (Luxembourg): carnival donuts
 - Baklava** (Montenegro): pastry filled with chopped nuts sweetened with syrup or honey
 - Trilece** (Montenegro): light sponge cake soaked in milk and topped with caramel
 - Pastel de nata** (Portugal): creamy caramelised pastries
 - Arroz doce** (Portugal): rice pudding with cinnamon
 - Pao de ló** (Portugal): moist sponge cake
 - Brigadeiro** (Brazil): a sweet candy made of condensed milk
